## Learning About New People Is Fun

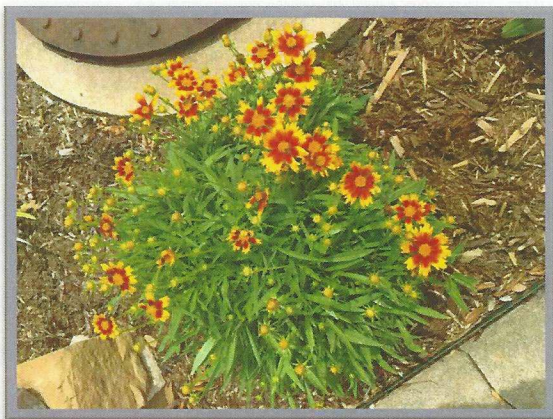

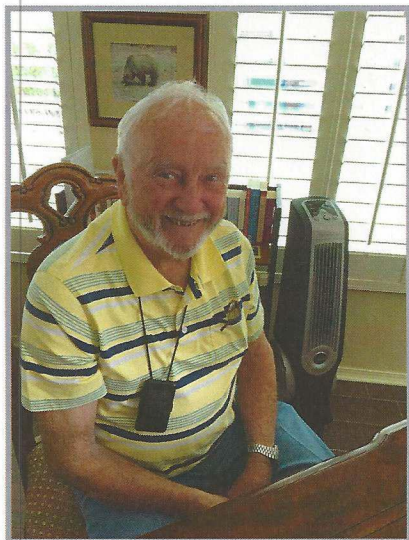
